### The Ten Commandments

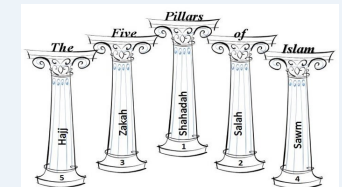


The Ten Commandments are important in Christianity and Judaism.

They are a set of principles linking to worship and behaving in the right way. For example, 'you shall not steal' and 'you shall not worship false Gods'.

### The Five Pillars of Islam

The Five Pillars of Islam are five duties that Muslims try to carry out. It helps them to feel like a part of the Muslim community. Each Pillar has a different name; Shahada, Salah, Zakat, Sawm and Hajj.
