



Also know as a Qur'an stand. A Rehal is an X-shaped, foldable book rest or lectern used for Placing holy books to show respect.



Key knowledge to know and use

- The Synagogue is a Jewish sacred place used for group prayer and learning.
- Jewish people pray three times a day at home: the morning, the afternoon and after sunset.
- The Shema is a special prayer that Jewish people say twice a day.
- Jewish people believe that praying regularly helps them to build their relationship with God.
- Muslims perform 'Wudu' before they pray, this is a ritual where they wash their faces, hands, arms and feet.
