The Siddur	The traditional Jewish prayer book.
Yad	A Jewish ritual pointer, also known as the Torah pointer. It is used by the reader to follow the text while reading the Torah.
Shema	A Jewish prayer which is used during the morning and evening prayers.
Salah	The second pillar of Islam based on prayer.
The Guru Granth Sahib	The Sikh holy book.



The Torah scroll

A sacred object kept by Jewish communities. They are housed in Synagogues and in special cabinets and are used in prayer services.

Rehal

Also known as a Qur'an stand. A Rehal is an X-shaped, foldable book rest or lectern used for placing holy books to show respect.



Key knowledge to know and use

- The Synagogue is a Jewish sacred place used for group prayer and learning.
- Jewish people pray three times a day at home: the morning, the afternoon and after sunset.
- The Shema is a special prayer that Jewish people say twice a day.
- Jewish people believe that praying regularly helps them to build their relationship with God.
- Muslims perform 'Wudu' before they pray, this is a ritual where they wash their faces, hands, arms and feet.
