Key vocabulary to remember and use in your learning

Word	Definition
hatching	An artistic technique which is used to build up tone in drawing. Hatching is a series of parallel lines.
illustration	A picture or visual representation that helps make something clear or attractive. We often see illustrations in books.
tone	In art and design, tone refers to how light or dark something is. Tones could refer to black, white and the grey tones between. It could refer to how light or dark a colour appears.



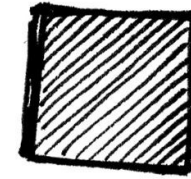
Sir Quentin Blake is best known for his illustrations of Roald Dahl's much-loved books.



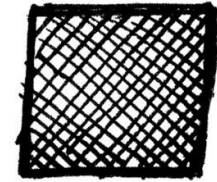

Key knowledge to know and use

Sir Quentin Blake is a famous artist and illustrator. He is best known for illustrating the Roald Dahl books. Through his illustrations, Quentin brought many favourite characters to life, such as Matilda, The BFG and The Enormous Crocodile. His drawings are very recognisable and often very funny.

Artists use drawing techniques to create tone in their work. Hatching is a simple technique which can help to bring light and dark into drawings.

Artists use drawing pencils when creating sketches. Drawing pencils have numbers and letters on them, to help artists to know which are lighter tones and which are darker tones.
