

Design Technology Year 4 Autumn: Christmas Decorations

Key Knowledge to know and use

- The design process starts with a design board. This is where ideas are gathered together. For example images, colour ideas and small pieces of material. This is used to narrow down ideas about what to make.
- Templates are shaped from card or other material, which are laid over fabric and then cut around. This will provide a clear shape for a product.
- A running stitch is series of stitches passing in and out of the material. This could be used to decorate the two halves of a product.
- An over stitch (also known as an overcast stitch) is a series of stitches that go under and over material and will be used to connect the two pieces together.
- Embroidery is the process where a piece of fabric is decorated using simple stitches.

Running stitch (top picture) and over stitch are two new stitches that you will be using on your project.

Word	Definition
running stitch	A simple stitch that passes in and out of the material you are sewing.
over stitch	A more complicated stitch, the over stitch goes along the outside edge of material, joining two pieces together.
design board	A collection of pictures and samples of materials that help you choose ideas when making something.
embroidery	The craft of decorating pieces of fabric with thread or other material using a needle.
template	A shaped piece of card or other stiff material, that is used as a pattern for cutting around.
