Breakfast Club

Thank you to all of you that are using our before school Breakfast Club provision. It is run by school staff who work very hard to make these morning sessions exciting and engaging for the children and, because of this, the club is proving to be very popular with the children that are accessing this.

I'd like to give a quick reminder to all parents to ensure that their child is booked onto Breakfast Club before bringing them in the mornings. We can only have a certain number of children each morning and, if this is exceeded, we won't be able to accept your children into the club. Please always book a place before dropping your children off.

It is also really important for the children's safety that if you are dropping off a child directly to Breakfast Club (via the car park) then you need to hand your child over to a member of Breakfast Club staff. This is because cars, and other vehicles used by the builders, may be moving around the car park at this time.

Thank you, again, for cooperating with this and for helping to make our Breakfast Club a success.

Christmas Trees

As well as the various Christmas trees that we have up around school currently, you may have also noticed that there are some Christmas trees outside the main entrance to school as well.
