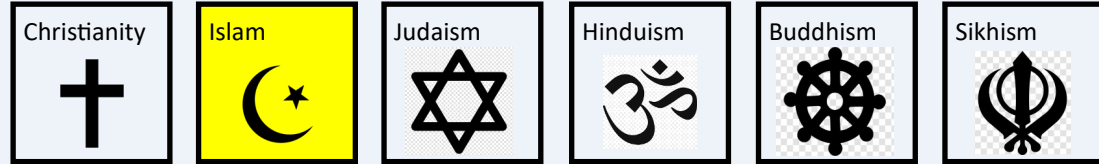

Year 2 – Who is a Muslim and how do they live? (Part 1)



Key vocabulary to remember and use in your learning

Word	Definition
Allah	God
Tawhid	The belief that there is only one God, and nothing is equal to God
Prophet	A messenger sent from Allah
Ramadan	A month where Muslims fast during the day light hours
Zakah	Giving of charity, the fourth pillar of Islam
Hajj	Pilgrimage to Mekkah to be made once in a lifetime if possible. The fifth pillar of Islam
Sawm	Fasting from food or liquids during day light hours in the month of Ramadan, the third pillar of Islam

Salah

Ritual prayer carried out five times per day. This is the second pillar of Islam.

Shahadah

The Muslim declaration of faith. It includes the beliefs that Allah is the only God, and that Muhammad is Allah's messenger.

Key knowledge to know and use

- Muslims believe there is only one God, and nothing is equal to God (Tawhid).
- An important way for Muslims to worship Allah is to complete the 5 pillars.
- Muslims will worship Allah through praying five times a day, known as Salah, by reading the Qur'an and by going to the mosque.
- The Shahadah tells Muslims that Muhammad is the prophet of Allah who received the Qur'an, the Muslim holy book from God.
- Muhammad received the first verses of the Qur'an on The Night of Power when he was on Mount Hira and, for the rest of his life, he received messages from Allah which Muslims can read in the Qur'an.
