






# RE Summer 2

### Key vocabulary to remember and use in your learning

Word	Definition
Tikkun Olam	In Judaism it is any activity that repairs the world.
Jewish	<b>Anything that is part of, or someone who follows Judaism.</b>
Christian	<b>Anything that is part of, or someone who follows Christianity.</b>
Muslim	<b>A person who submits to the will of Allah by following the religion of Islam.</b>
Zakat	Giving of charity usually 2.5% of income; the 2nd Pillar of Islam.
Stewardship	The act of looking after and caring for something.
Steward	<b>Someone who looks after or cares for something for someone else.</b>
Salvation	Being saved or rescued so that humans are no longer separated from God.

### Humanist

A person who does not believe in a god. They believe it is possible to live a good and fulfilling life without following a traditional religion.

### Golden Rule

A belief that everyone should treat each other how they would like to be treated.

### Key knowledge to know and use

- The Golden Rule is something that worldviews view as something that everyone can follow .
- In Jewish worldviews there is the teaching of Tikkun Olam which means to mend or repair the world.
- Stewardship is important in Christianity and Islam as God asked humanity to look after the earth he had created.
- Muslims believe they have a duty to make the world a better place for the people who live in it as a form of worship to Allah.
